the majority of their business is take-out and business delivery (717)270-9830, they do have a few seats for people to visit Monday - Friday between 7:30AM-2PM. Delivery runs from Maple Street on the north; to Evergreen on the south; the Lebanon Valley Mall on the west; and Walmart on the east end of Lebanon. On weekends, they also cater weddings, luncheons, class reunions.... For payment, Laura says they take, "credit cards, personal checks, and help with the dishes." Of Greek heritage, they serve spinach pie, baklava, and gyros as well as all American food. Also for sale are family fresh olive oil and salad dressing.

Rita's father and her uncle, Jack and Joe Vranesic, ran the Golden Ball Hotel in Quentin back in the 1950s.

In RC Deli, you'll see artifacts from the Eatwell Diner--pictures, dinner plates and a milkshake machine. The day that I visited, Constantino, "Gus" for short, Laura's Dad, reminisced about owning the Eatwell Diner from 1956-2000 on Cumberland Street. While the Eatwell no longer stands, the Diner lives on in his heart and Elikzaville, New York.
